Dear Parents/Carers

As you are all aware the main GCSE exams season is getting underway very soon. In some subjects like Dance exams have already been completed and in other areas, Art and Drama, these are taking place this week. Therefore, the next few weeks are an extremely crucial time and it is very important that your children are fully prepared for the weeks ahead.

Attached is an Exam and Revision Workshop timetable which has the details of when each exam is taking place along with the times and dates of subject specific revision sessions. A copy of this can be found on our academy website www.dslv.org.uk.

The revision sessions begin on Friday 12th May and will continue right up until the last exam on 20th June. All students must attend DSLV full time up to Friday 26th May. From Monday 7th June, students are only expected to attend exams and revision workshops that apply to them as detailed on the timetable. However, lessons will run as normal until the final exam for that subject area. If your child is unsure they should speak to their subject teachers and form tutors for assistance.

It is very important that all students attend their exams fully prepared by being dressed appropriately and by having the correct equipment. If they are not dressed in full academy uniform they may be refused entry to the exam itself and therefore put their grade in jeopardy. So please ensure students have the correct uniform for each and every exam.

When sitting exams students cannot have any electronic equipment on their person. This includes all mobile phones, I-pods, I-watches and MP3 players. Students are requested to hand these in before an exam starts if they still have them on their person. Failure to do so could lead to disqualification from the exam.

Finally, in relation to the running of the exams, we insist that all students must attend each exam that they have been entered for. Failure to do so may result in you having to pay for the cost of the exam except in cases where a medical note is provided due to an illness.

I am hoping we can count on your continued support over the next couple of months in helping our young people achieve to the best of their abilities.
